

Use Uponor PP-RCT hot potable pipe to convey water for hot potable plumbing applications. The fiber layer coextruded into the mid-wall of the pipe to reduce expansion/contraction with temperature changes also makes the pipe acceptable for use in hydronic heating and cooling applications.
